
## The number of Ukrainians supporting the legalization of civilian firearms has increased over the past year. More than half of the population wants to buy traumatic weapons — a survey by Gradus Research


The Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine approved in the first reading the Law on the Circulation of Civilian Firearms on the eve of Russia's full-scale invasion to Ukraine. The bill is currently being prepared for second reading, and a research company Gradus Research conducted a survey to find out how Ukrainians view the legalization of weapons for civilians during the war and compared them with the results of a similar survey from 2021.



The survey finds that **43% of citizens rather or completely support the legalization of civilian firearms in Ukraine**, while a year ago this position was expressed by a third of the population (34%). It is also noticeable that the highest support for legalization is observed among Ukrainians who were forced to leave their places of permanent residence and move to other regions of Ukraine due to the war (46%).


Among the **reasons for the legalization of weapons for civilians**, Ukrainians often list the opportunity to feel safe, protect themselves and their loved ones (71%) and to be ready to defend in case of a large-scale military conflict (56%).

## REASONS FOR SUPPORTING AND NOT SUPPORTING WEAPONS LEGALIZATION (2022)



As for those Ukrainians **who have a negative attitude to the legalization of civilian firearms**, there are currently 41% of them. While more than half (52%) of Ukrainians shared this position a year ago. They often argue their opinion by the fact that this may lead to an increase of crime rate (71%), or that the Ukrainian society is not ready for this (58%) and that the use of firearms will be difficult to control (53%).

More than half of the respondents (52%) **would like to buy a traumatic weapon**, while 37% answered that they would definitely or rather not buy it if they had the opportunity. These indicators have remained stable since last year. Those who want to possess a traumatic weapon, mainly want it to protect themselves, their loved ones and their home.



The survey was conducted by the research company Gradus Research using the method of self-filling the questionnaire in the mobile application.
